Conditions:

- Scale of Points for judging collections: Variety 10, Quality 10, and Display 5.
- All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor
- All root vegetables to be washed and have some tops
- All bunches to be tied
- Vegetables to be placed on a white paper plate in a plastic bag
- Stalk vegetables and herbs must be standing in a clear jar provided by the exhibitor. (Stewards will fill with water when placed on tables)
- AV means any variety

2. Onions, Brown - 3
3. Carrots - 4 – complete with tops
4. Cucumber Lebanese
5. Rhubarb - 6 sticks

SECTION W – FLORICULTURE & HERBS

Section Stewards:

Entry forms to be in by Wednesday, 187th October 2019 – no late entries accepted

Awards presented for: Overall Points Winner

Conditions:

- All plants and flowers must be grown by exhibitor except informal floral art and children.
- Flowers judged for quality
- Pot Plants must have been grown by exhibitor for the past 6 months
- Exhibitor to use containers of own choice except where otherwise stated
- Distinct means different colour and/or names
- Specimen Flowers must face judge. This is important.
- Specimen Flowers must have own stem and foliage.
- Bowl – A bowl is a vessel that has a diameter equal or greater than the height. The diameter of the mouth is to be not less than two thirds of the total diameter. Anything less is defined a vase.
- Vase – Height should be greater than width.
- Oasis or floral foam may be used but must be concealed.

Hints:

- Bleach one teaspoon in bucket of water to keep down bacteria. Does not damage flowers
- Carry cut flowers to show in water
- To prevent air bubbles in stems, cut under water
- Special attention should be paid to conditioning flowers and foliage. They must stand in water for AT LEAST 2 HOURS. Material that is not conditioned in this way will not last for the duration of the Show.

SPECIMEN CLASS

All Cuts/Specimens To Be In Separate Jars / Bottles Unless Otherwise Stated.

Class

1. Rose – HT (1) specimen not buds
2. Rose - David Austin – (1) cut - Cluster of flowers with or without buds
3. Rose - Floribunda – (1) cut
4. Sweet Peas – 6 stems - 1 colour, (2) cuts per container
5. Iris -Tall bearded - (1) stalk
6. Iris – Dutch - (1) stalk
7. Snapdragon – (1) single specimen
8. Delphinium – (1) cut
9. Australian Flowering Ornamental Tree or Shrub - (1) cut e.g. Grevillea, Gum
10. Creeper in bloom, not exceeding 60cm. Out of container – (1) cut
11. Garden flowers – (3) cuts, distinct, separate containers
12. Orchid – (1)
13. Geranium – (1) single stem, one leaf
14. Pelargonium, single stem, one leaf – (1)
15. Any other flower not specified - (1)



BOWLS AND VASES

Conditions:

- Exhibitors must supply own bowl or vase (no handles)
 - Vase must be of greater height than width
 - Bowl – A bowl is a vessel that has a diameter equal or greater than the height. The diameter of the mouth is to be not less than two thirds of the total diameter. Anything less is defined a vase.
 - Bowls and vases must be formal – to be viewed all around
 - Bowls and vases must have own foliage
